- Read Q# 1-8 aloud and discuss the answers. Point out the illustrations and diagrams and allow family members to explain them. Read the captions on the illustrations. Read the Scripture quotes.
- Discuss the "Doctrine, Moral, Worship Exercises" and the "Thought Provokers" related to Q# 1-8, found at the end of Chapters 1 and 2.

Closing Prayer (10 min.)

It is important to develop a prayer life. Families can encourage this by having a common time and place for family prayer. One of the traditional prayer methods is called Mental Prayer.

Family Activity

Three Forms of Water

Melt several ice cubes (representing God the Father) in a pan (resulting water representing God the Son). Bring to a boil (vapor representing God the Holy Spirit). Cover with a lid until water condenses inside the lid. Turn off fire and return condensed water to pan. Refreeze to demonstrate all three forms are one and the same – water. Now imagine that water could be a solid, a liquid and a gas all the time and at the same time. In the same way, Father, Son and Holy Spirit are one and the same God.

1. Not sharing 2. Insisting on being first

Copy this list for each one's use to prepare for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Close the activity with a short prayer, expressing sorrow for offending Jesus. Little children can be guided in a prayer of sorrow by Mom or Dad.

Family Activity

Pray the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary found on the next page. You can use this "Conversational Method" (family members taking turns) for the most fervent and fruitful praying of the Rosary:

- 1. Announce the Mystery
- 2. Pause to reflect on its significance
- 3. Formulate prayer intentions that relate to the Mystery (e.g. Nativity Intention: for all children, especially newly born babies)
- 4. Recite the decade

Commit to praying as a family at least one decade after every evening meal. Pray more decades while traveling together in the car.



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Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary

First Joyful Mystery: The Annunciation of the Archangel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary We ask for the gifts of the Holy Spirit and an increase in the virtue of humility.

Second Joyful Mystery: The Visitation of the Virgin Mary to Elizabeth, the Mother of St. John the Baptist.

We ask for the gifts of the Holy Spirit and an increase in the virtue of generosity.

Third Joyful Mystery: The Birth of Our Lord at Bethlehem

We ask for the gifts of the Holy Spirit and an increase in the virtue of detachment from the things of this world.

Fourth Joyful Mystery: The Presentation of Our Lord in the Temple

We ask for the gifts of the Holy Spirit and an increase in the virtue of obedience.

Fifth Joyful Mystery: The Finding of Our Lord in the Temple

We ask for the gifts of the Holy Spirit and an increase in the virtue of fear of the Lord—fear of ever losing God because of our sins.

How to pray the Rosary

Pray the Apostles' Creed (#6a) while holding the Crucifix. Then offer one Our Father (#6b) on the large bead and three Hail Mary's (#6c) on each of the three small beads for the Holy Father, the Pope. After the three Hail Mary's, pray the Glory Be (#7a), the Fatima Rosary Prayer (#7b), and the Consecration Prayer (#7c).

Select one group of Mysteries. Announce the first Mystery and meditate on it while praying one Our Father on the large bead and ten Hail Mary's on each of the ten small beads.

On the next large bead, pray the Glory Be, the Rosary Prayer, and the Consecration Prayer. Then, announce the second Mystery and begin again with the Our Father, ten Hail Mary's, etc. Continue until you have prayed all five decades.

To end the Rosary, pray the Hail Holy Queen (#2b) or the St. Joseph Prayer after the Rosary (#8).



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6a. Apostles' Creed

6b. Our Father

Our Father Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy Kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

6c. Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace; the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

7a. Glory Be

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

7b. Fatima Rosary Prayer

O My Jesus, forgive us our sins; save us from the fires of hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who are in most need of Your mercy.

7c. All For Consecration Prayer

Can be said after each decade of the Rosary following 7b.

All for the Sacred and Eucharistic Heart of Jesus, all through the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary, all in union with St. Joseph.



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2b. Hail Holy Queen

Hail Holy Queen, Mother of mercy; our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning, and weeping in this valley of tears.

Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us; and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Amen.

8. St. Joseph Prayer after the Rosary

Glorious St. Joseph, spouse of the Immaculate Virgin, obtain for me and all the members of my family and loved ones, a confident, sinless, generous, and patient heart, and perfect resignation to the Divine Will. Review of Memory Verses Activity

To solidify memorization and to experience how God's word is "living and active," cut up copies of the verses from the past eight weeks, provided on page 2. Put them in a container. At the evening meal, every person draws one, reads and replaces.

Instruct everyone to think about their verse the following day as God's special word to them for that day. At the succeeding evening meal, have each person share how their word spoke to them in the course of the day.

For little children, give them a simple phrase from their verse to repeat throughout the day. For example, "Your word is truth." or "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God."

UGALI – FOOD OF AFRICA

Ugali, a staple starch component of many African meals, is generally made from maize flour (or ground maize) and water, and varies in consistency from porridge to a dough-like substance.

The traditional method of eating ugali as a main course (and the most common in the rural areas) is to roll a lump into a ball with the right hand and then dip it into a sauce or stew of vegetables and/or meat. Making a depression with the thumb allows the ugali to be used to scoop, and to wrap around pieces of meat to pick them up in the same way that flat bread is used in other cultures.

Ugali is inexpensive to make and the flour can last for considerable time in average conditions. Also, the crops that produce the corn flour will grow reliably in poor seasons. For these reasons, ugali is an important part of the diet of millions of Africans.

KENYA FOR INSTANCE...

Kenya is a low-income, food-deficient country. Forty-three percent of the population lives in unconditional poverty. Many small farmers have an unreliable food security. Corn is the main staple in Kenya. It is made into porridge, called ugali, and mixed with other foods to make a stew. **However**, farm families often just eat the porridge plain because other foods cannot be obtained.

It is hard to find clean water, because good wells are miles from the home. If clean water cannot be afforded in jugs, many Kenyan women and girls will wait in a long line to use the public faucets. However, the water from these faucets is not often clean.

The food needs of children are related to their growth and development. It is important that all children, ages six and up get to eat from each of the five food groups everyday. Vegetables provide vitamin A, C, folic acid and minerals. Fruits can provide vitamin A, C and minerals. Dairy will provide protein and calcium for those growing bones. Breads and cereals will provide vitamin B, fiber, and energy from carbohydrates. Dried beans, meats, fish and poultry provide protein, iron and zinc. Clean drinking water is also a necessity.

UGALI RECIPE

Water 4 cups (more or less depending on desired consistency)

Salt 2 tsp Cornmeal, white, finely ground 2 cups

Bring water and salt to a boil in a heavy-bottomed saucepan. Stir in cornmeal slowly, letting it fall though the fingers of your hand. Turn heat to medium-low, and continue stirring regularly and smashing any lumps until mush pulls away from the sides of the pot and becomes very thick, about 10 minutes. Allow to cool somewhat. Place into a serving bowl. Wet your hands with water, form into a ball and serve.

Review of Memory Verses Activity

- 31) Ephesians 4:31-32 Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.
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
